


DECLARATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, some protests in response to the death of George Perry Floyd while in police custody in Minneapolis, Minnesota, have devolved into civil disturbance, causing the serious threat of damage to property and affecting seriously the safety, health and welfare of individuals in the Borough of Lansdowne.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Anthony Campuzano, Mayor of the Borough of Lansdowne (the "Borough"), do hereby declare a Disaster Emergency exists for the Borough pursuant to the authority vested by the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services Code, P.L. 1332, November 26, 1978, as amended, 35 Pa.C.S.A. § 7501(b), and § 46006-A of the Pennsylvania Borough Code beginning on as of May 31, 2020 due to the threat of civil disturbance in the Borough and other areas of the County. During the Disaster Emergency a curfew shall be in effect, and no person shall be on the public streets or in the public parks or parking lots between the hours of 9:00 PM and 6:00 AM. This declaration shall remain in effect until revoked entirely or in part by me in writing, or in seven (7) days, unless revoked or extended by a majority of the Borough Council of the County of Delaware, whichever shall occur earlier.

The emergency provisions of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services Code relating to contracts and obligations (35 Pa.C.S.A. § 7501(c)); the temporary suspension of formal requirements (35 Pa.C.S.A. § 7501(d)); and the employment of personnel (35 Pa.C.S.A. § 7501(e)) are hereby enabled.
